#### **Background**

In the Middle East, Jordan is among the front runners regarding PPP and PSP as various PSP models are already in place. The German bi-lateral co-operation supports – through its Water Program – all relevant Jordanian institutions of the water sector. Within this program, a key objective is to increase the private sector participation.

Due to its expertise in PPP and PSP projects and its excellent knowledge of the Jordanian water sector, DFIC was entrusted with the development of the concept, the acquisition of lecturers and participants as well as with the development of the proceedings.

#### **Objectives**

The objective of this event was to present possible PPP/PSP approaches between stakeholders from the Jordanian and the European water sectors and define specific business opportunities, more specifically within the framework of Micro-PSP.
